The successful applicants for October 2012 are:

Kura Yerlo Inc.	Kura Yerlo will train two staff members in leading bicycle group rides. These staff members will then run a cycling program for children, youth and parents in their local area to increase skills, capacity and confidence when cycling on road. The project will also encourage their clients to get to the centre by public transport.	\$6578
Novita Children's Services	Novita will purchase videoconferencing equipment to reduce the amount of car travel staff undertake in commuting between Novita office sites and within metropolitan and regional areas. The project will deliver significant safety, financial and time benefits to Novita and their clients.	\$8958

Roxby Roadsafe	Roxby Roadsafe will present free Child Safety Restraint workshops for parents and carers throughout their community, physically checking vehicles for correct installation. They will also train local residents in order for them to deliver future education programs to the community on an ongoing basis. (Project funded by the Motor Accident Commission).	\$4500
Southern Flinders Health (Laura campus)	The Laura Hospital will purchase a bicycle and accessories to be used by hospital staff as an alternative to the car when carrying out their daily duties within the community.	\$1070
Kirinari Community School	Kirinari will provide bicycle education for their students, including practical lessons and follow up classroom work, and enhance their current bicycle storage facilities. They will also make public transport information available in the school office and facilitate links between neighbouring families to share journeys to and from school.	\$2125
Semaphore Uniting Church	The Semaphore Uniting Church cycling group will provide four of its members with training to lead the group rides. This will assist group members with mental health conditions and disabilities to improve their road safety knowledge, cycling skills, increase independence and confidence when cycling on metropolitan roads.	\$3200
Barunga West Community Road Safety Group	The Barunga West Community Road Safety Group will deliver a gopher safety and information session to the local community.	\$709
