The project will refurbish and re-gift donated bicycles and provide safety equipment, safe cycling training and journey planning tools.	\$7,000.00
Resthaven Incorporated Shopping with a keyboard	With funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission this project will replace car journeys associated with shopping for clients with technology, by implementing on-line shopping and deliveries to clients' homes.	\$2,270.00
Ian George Court On the move	This project will support residents with complex needs to build skills, fitness and confidence by substituting car trips with walking, cycling and using public transport. The project will also support staff and volunteers to use walking, cycling and public transport for journeys when accompanying clients and for other work related travel.	\$4,437.00
Uniting Care Wesley Port Adelaide 5 C's City and Country Clearly and Cleanly Connected	With project funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission, Uniting Care Wesley Port Adelaide will reduce the amount of car travel conducted by staff travelling between Mt Gambier and Adelaide for meetings and training by using videoconferencing technology.	\$1,891.00

Lutheran Community Care Ride instead for health and happiness	This project will support staff at Lutheran Community Care sites in Blair Athol, Sefton Park and Magill to replace car journeys with cycling to meetings and other work related destinations. Staff will be supported through the purchase of a work bicycle at each location and training in safe cycling and bicycle maintenance.	\$5,800.00
Unity Housing Boarding house bike project	This project aims to increase the use of cycling by Unity Housing tenants for journeys within the Adelaide CBD and near city locations. A bicycle rack and bike shelters will be installed and bicycle maintenance classes will be provided to increase tenants' skills to maintain their bikes.	\$5,000.00
Adelaide Day Centre for Homeless Persons Leave your car at home	This project will encourage clients to use public transport and cycling to replace car journeys. Staff will work with clients to encourage public transport use and accompany clients on cycling journeys to appointments within the Adelaide CBD.	\$6,798.00
