TITLE OF POSITION: SIGNAL MAINTENANCE FITTER

CLASSIFICATION LEVEL: C10

Organisation Overview

The Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI) serves the South Australian community by providing safe, effective and efficient planning, transport and infrastructure networks across the state and facilitating development of the State's Infrastructure, in accordance with South Australia's Strategic Plan and the State Infrastructure Plan.

Division

The Safety and Service Division comprises four directorates: Transport Operations, Asset Management, Infrastructure Delivery and Regulation.

This role forms part of the Asset Management Directorate, Rail Infrastructure Maintenance Section, and Signals Unit.

Role Overview

The Signal Maintenance Fitter is responsible for ensuring the effective and safe movement of rail and tram services including the maintenance and repair of mechanical right of way signalling equipment, associated plant and general mechanical equipment:

- Installing, maintaining and repairing right of way signalling equipment and associated plant
- Inspecting and maintaining hydraulic signalling equipment
- Installing, maintaining and repairing standby power plant, UPS systems and 650 Volt Power systems.
- Assisting in the installation and commissioning of new systems that involve testing, checking to specifications, monitoring equipment operation and performance, assisting in fault finding and diagnosis

The role is accountable to the Unit Manager Signals and liaises with a range of internal and external customers, including service providers, contractors, Asset Maintenance workgroups and members of the public.

Key Outcomes of the Role

The Signal Maintenance Fitter is required to undertake a wide range of activities, including, but not limited to, the following:

- a. Establishing work priorities and scheduling detailed work functions and contributing to the preparation of resources and equipment for signal maintenance activities
- b. Understanding and applying quality standards relevant to the level and skills, knowledge of the incumbent
- c. Performing maintenance and repair on the mechanical signalling system including rodding, stretcher bars and generators, and signalling/level crossing equipment
- d. Performing maintenance and repair on diesel generators, UPS units and 650 Volt Power systems.
- e. Interpret and apply complex instructions and procedures and technical information using relevant experience, knowledge and judgement and provide advice on various signal maintenance activities and preparing and maintaining records and reports as required
- f. Prepare and operate a range of complex machinery, equipment and/or facilities and providing trade or trade equivalent guidance and assistance, within the area of expertise, to other employees
- g. Actively participate in the identification and implementation of strategies to control risks, including reporting notifiable occurrences and environmental incidents
- h. Performing work either individually, or as part of a team and may, from time to time be required to perform work at a lower level or other work appropriate to the classification
- i. Contributing to a safe, diverse and healthy work environment free from discrimination and harassment by working in accordance with legislative requirements, the Code of Ethics for the South Australian Public Sector, equal employment opportunity and departmental human resource policies, including Work Health Safety and Wellbeing requirements
- j. Contributing to a high standard of customer service for internal and external clients and quality management and risk.
- k. Assisting in carrying out any relevant internal investigations as requested to the cause or contributing facts to any incident or derailment

Special Conditions and Essential Requirements

Identified as a Rail Safety Worker role, classified as Safety Critical Worker Category 1 and is subject to periodic health assessments as per Rail Safety National Law (SA) 2012.

All Rail Safety Workers must carry out duties in accordance with Rail Safety National Law (SA) 2012 and as outlined within the Rail Commissioner's Safety Management System.

Required to work shiftwork in accordance with a seven (7) day roster including early morning, night, weekend and public holiday shifts.

Required to participate in an on call roster and attend emergency callouts as necessary.

Possess and maintain appropriate Driver's and operational licences appropriate to the role and legislative requirements.

Qualifications / Licences

- a. Certificate III in Electrotechnology Electrician or equivalent Trade qualification
- b. Current SA Driver's Licence is essential

Person Capabilities
