Community Grants for safer, greener and more active travel – February 2014

The Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI), in partnership with the Motor Accident Commission recently awarded further Community Grants for safer, greener and more active travel. The successful applicants for February 2014 are:

Uniting Church in Australia Adelaide West Shining light – riding by bike	With funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission this project will encourage members to replace car use with commuting by bike. The project will install a bike rack and provide resources and safe cycling workshops, to increase cycling skills and road safety knowledge. Options for carpooling and public transport will also be encouraged for those who are not able to participate in riding bikes.	\$9,108.00
Magwi Development Agency Australia Inc MAADA Travelling with the environment in mind	This project will train 15 MAADA volunteers as active travel ‘champions’ who will provide information sessions and support refugee families to gain skills and confidence in using public transport. Trial metro cards will be provided as a further incentive to encourage people to participate.	\$2,830.00
The Friends of the Queen Elizabeth Hospital Volunteering carpooling	With funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission this project will support the Friends of the Queen Elizabeth Hospital Volunteers to develop a carpooling project for travel to and from voluntary work. The project will reduce car use and provide an alternative transport option for those considering retiring from or reducing their driving.	\$3,840.00

<p>Adelaide City Council</p> <p>Access community services education program</p>	<p>This project will provide workshop sessions in community languages to support migrants to gain knowledge, skills and confidence in using active travel modes. This includes a practical component to access destinations using city bikes, trams, trains and buses, supported by trial metro cards.</p>	<p>\$5,000.00</p>
<p>Re-Engage Youth</p> <p>Deadly treadly project</p>	<p>This project will provide bike maintenance skills to young people who will refurbish and gift donated bicycles to community members, to reduce car use and overcome transport barriers.</p>	<p>\$7,990.00</p>
<p>The Burundian Association In South Australia (ABCSA)</p> <p>Right ride for refugees</p>	<p>This project will provide 6 ABCSA volunteers with skills to conduct safe cycling training with new migrants. The project will provide training bikes and assist participants to gain cycling skills and increase confidence when cycling on metropolitan roads.</p>	<p>\$7,055.00</p>
<p>Hanson Construction Materials Pty Ltd</p> <p>Hanson – ride instead of drive</p>	<p>This project will support staff at Hanson Construction Materials Pty. Ltd to replace car journeys with riding a work bike to meetings and other work related destinations. The project will begin at the Marleston site and explore the potential use of work bikes at other sites across South Australia.</p>	<p>\$2,500.00</p>
<p>Hutt Street Centre</p> <p>Putting the ‘H’ into WH&S</p>	<p>This project will encourage staff and clients to use cycling to replace car journeys. The project will provide work bikes for work related travel and for staff to accompany clients on cycling journeys to appointments within the Adelaide CBD and outskirts.</p>	<p>\$4,247.75</p>
<p>South West City Residents Association (SWCRA)</p> <p>Getting out and about</p>	<p>This project aims to encourage participants to swap car use for active travel modes. The project will expand the SWCRA newsletter to include a ‘green travel’ section and conduct a series of mini ‘travel expos’ to encourage use of public transport, cycling, contra flow bike lanes, walking and car sharing.</p>	<p>\$1,320.00</p>
