Community Grants for safer, greener and more active travel – February 2013

The Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI), in partnership with the Motor Accident Commission recently awarded further Community Grants for safer, greener and more active travel. The successful applicants for February 2013 are:

Country Health SA Local Health Network Mid North Health Booleroo Centre bike pool	The Booleroo Centre bike pool is intended to promote smarter travel among employees at the Booleroo Centre. The project will target employees to use pool bicycles for workplace travel.	\$1,700.00
Somali Bantu Community Association of Australia Public transport use, walking and cycling	This project will provide homework support volunteers and their students with the skills, knowledge and experience to travel by bicycle or public transport. Volunteers will be trained to train other community members to cycle safely and use public transport. Volunteers will provide the families that they assist with information, support and access to resources to reduce their family's car use.	\$7,300.00
Leveda Inc Ride a bike for a better life	This project aims to increase the use of cycling by staff, disability clients and carers. The organisation will provide workshops and training on how to use bicycles, encourage commitments to cycling more often and support individuals through the changes.	\$9,535.00
Minda Inc Transport transitioning training	With project funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission this project builds client's independence and confidence to use public transport to travel to work and reduce the need for carers to drive clients to their place of employment.	\$3,035.00



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The Synod of the Anglican Church of Australia in the Diocese of Willochra Inc Connecting Willochra and the World	With project funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission the Diocese will reduce the amount of car travel conducted by staff and volunteers for meetings and training by using videoconferencing technology.	\$12,110.00
Naracoorte Lucindale Community Road Safety Group Inc Schools, safety and speed	With project funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission this project will engage parents and drivers around schools and kindergartens in the Naracoorte and Lucindale area to commit to obey speed limits and signs, particularly when driving to drop off / pick up children from school.	\$1,800.00
Australian Services Union Union on the move	This project will support staff to cycle to meetings and events within the CBD and its surrounds.	\$2,080.00
DK Quarries Pty Ltd Ride to work	This project will encourage employees to cycle and replace short car trips when attending to maintenance issues in the workplace.	\$1,296.00
Carers Association of South Australia Inc Carers SA video conferencing	With project funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission this project will purchase videoconferencing equipment to limit car journeys among the Association's regional offices.	\$4,018.00
Mount Remarkable Road Safety Group Safety for all ages	With project funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission this project will: 1) establish a display at local hotels and have conversations with patrons about drink driving and blood alcohol limits.	\$1,330.00



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	2) deliver a series of information sessions on the safety regulations and compliance requirements for farmers who drive heavy equipment. 3) deliver an information session for gopher users on safe driving strategies, choosing an appropriate mobility scooter and road rules.	
Service to Youth Know your neighbourhood	With project funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission the project will encourage young people residing in Service to Youth Council's Helping Young People Achieve (HYPA) housing properties at Mansfield Park to get out of their cars and walk to local shops and services, thereby getting to know their local neighbourhood. A Group Leader will lead the project initially with the intention of empowering clients to support other clients in walking more often once the project gains momentum.	\$4,000.00
Adelaide Bike Kitchen Adelaide Bike Kitchen community trailers	This project will provide Adelaide Bike Kitchen workshop volunteers with the skills and tools necessary to design and build a small fleet of six bicycle trailers for use both within the organisation and throughout the wider community. They will also support the community to build their own.	\$3,292.00
Adelaide Hills Farmers Market Bike to the market	Bike to the market program aims to encourage families cycle to the Farmers Market in Mt Barker. The project will use a variety of methods, including group rides, workshops and incentives to help change family travel behaviour.	\$2,620.00



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
