

Streaky Bay Jetty Remediation

Project update

We are undertaking remediation works at the Streaky Bay Jetty to improve the structural integrity and the lifespan of the Jetty.

These works are being undertaken as part of the SA Jetties Renewal Program that is in place to assist local councils to address critical works across the State's jetties.

The Streaky Bay Jetty, a 340-meter-long iconic town jetty, is a key tourist attraction in South Australia.

The jetty pool, a shark-proof swimming enclosure active since 1936, along with the vessel berthing and mooring facilities, make Streaky Bay Jetty highly valuable to the local community, as well as commercial and recreational fishers.

In early 2024, structural assessments and investigation works were conducted to evaluate the jetty's condition. These assessments have determined the remediation works that will now be carried out. Please see over the page for more information about what's planned.

Works are expected to commence in September 2024 and be complete in the second quarter of 2025.







What's happening

The proposed works aim to extend the jetty's lifespan, improve safety for all users and enhance the overall jetty user experience.

The works will include:

- Replacing structural timber piles with steel piles.
- Replacing decayed timber structures.
- Upgrading berthing and mooring structures with additional piles and rubber fenders at the sea end of the Jetty.
- Installing new safety ladders for easier onboarding and offloading to and from berthed vessels.
- New resting benches adjacent the jetty shelter.
- Extending handrails where needed.

The new berthing and mooring structures will accommodate vessels up to 70 tonnes *(currently unrated)*. This will ensure Streaky Bay Jetty meets Marine Facilities Standards.

Temporary closure of the jetty

To ensure the safety of the community and our contractors, the jetty will be temporarily closed to all users during the construction period. This includes marine vessels which will not be able to berth during construction.

During this time, vessels can berth and refuel at Thevenard or Venus Bay.

We will do our best to open sections of the jetty as work is completed and where it is safe to do so, however we anticipate the majority of the jetty will be closed for most of the work period. The recently upgraded shark-proof swimming enclosure at the Streaky Bay Jetty is not being altered as part of this project but will also need to temporarily close during the refurbishment works for safety reasons.

The Shelter on the landside of the Jetty will remain open and accessible at all times throughout construction.

What's next

Our Project team will be in Streaky Bay at the jetty shelter on:

- Tuesday 16 July 2024 between 4pm and 6pm.
- Wednesday 17 July 2024 between 9am and 11am.

Drop by anytime during these times to speak with our team and discuss the works.

We will continue to work closely with District Council of Streaky Bay to ensure the jetty timber is repurposed locally where possible.
