

Glen Osmond Road and Fullarton Road Intersection Upgrade

Project Update

The Australian and South Australian governments have jointly (50:50) committed \$35 million to upgrade the Glen Osmond Road and Fullarton Road intersection. Once complete, the upgrade will improve travel times and road safety, increase intersection capacity and enhance network reliability.

Early works are well underway, with road construction scheduled to commence in September 2022. Around one third of the overall upgrade works are complete.

Approximately 1.4 kilometres of trenching has been completed, with over 5 kilometres of conduit installed underground.

The upgraded intersection is expected to be open to traffic late 2022, weather permitting.

What's Next: August – September 2022

Service relocation works – ongoing

These works include the relocation of power, telecommunications, water and gas services.

While most of these works are being undertaken during the day, some night works are required to ensure the works can be undertaken safely and efficiently.

Night works for service relocations will continue throughout August 2022 and be undertaken between 7pm and 6am, Sunday to Friday. There will be no night works undertaken on Saturdays.

Individual service providers, including SAPN, Telstra, NBN, SA Water and APA Gas will advise property owners of any potential interruptions to services during these works.

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses as much as practically possible. This includes scheduling intrusive works during the day or early evening where possible.

While every effort will be made to ensure the intersection remains open to traffic at all times, to safely facilitate works, some short-term closures of local roads may be required. Advanced notice of these closures will be provided and any required detours will be clearly signed.

The project team will contact property owners whose access is affected by the works. Every effort will be made to minimise impacts to surrounding properties and road users, as much as practically possible.

Civil works

Property demolition activities were completed in July 2022. Road construction works are expected to commence in late August 2022 and will involve earthworks to allow for widening on all corners of the intersection. As well as intersection works at Glen Osmond Road and Fullarton Road, road construction will also commence on the realignment of Main Avenue in September 2022.

SA Power Networks undergrounding

As part of the project, SAPN electrical infrastructure at and around the intersection will be upgraded. This will involve removing the existing overhead network (stobie poles and overhead connections) and connecting individual properties to a new underground network currently being installed. You will notice stobie poles being removed in August 2022 and September 2022.

Temporary bus stops changes

To safely facilitate upcoming road works, there will be some temporary relocations and closures of bus stops around the intersection. Advance notice of any temporary changes will be provided at the bus stops and on the Adelaide Metro website www.adelaidemetro.com.au

Pedestrian and cyclist access changes

To safely facilitate road works, pedestrian and cyclist detours will be in place. Advance notice of these detours will be provided, and signage will be in place to direct pedestrians and cyclists to alternative access.

Right turn reinstatement

In response to feedback received, the right turn from Fullarton Road into Glen Osmond Road, heading towards the South Eastern Freeway, will be reinstated.

The design has been updated to reinstate this right turn, which will be managed by a green arrow at all times. The updated design has been provided over the page, and is also available to view on the project website at www.dit.sa.gov.au/glenosmond
