



# Princes Highway Upgrade

## Project Update – Defects Identified

The Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department) is delivering infrastructure upgrades on the Princes Highway, from Meningie to the South Australian/Victorian border. These upgrades are jointly funded by the Australian and South Australian governments (80:20).

We are aware of a number of defects at multiple locations along the Princes Highway. Our contractor, Acciona, is investigating the causes of these defects and developing a program to remediate these areas as soon as possible. We will continue to work collaboratively with Acciona to ensure remediation works are undertaken as soon as possible.

We appreciate that works along the Princes Highway have been ongoing for an extended period of time and apologise for inconvenience caused.

We would like to thank you for your patience and understanding while these critical upgrade works are undertaken.

To ensure everyone's safety, speed and lane restrictions are currently in place along the new overtaking lanes 7 kms north of Millicent, and speed restrictions are in place at the Furner Road junction and the Tantanoola overtaking lane extension 13 km south-east of Millicent. Please plan your journey and allow extra time when travelling.
