

City Tram Extension Project

SAPN Infrastructure works: January 2018

December 2017

The Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure would like to notify you of upcoming works to be carried out by SA Power Networks (SAPN) on North Terrace as part of the City Tram Extension Project.

These works are scheduled to commence at **6am on Monday 8 January 2018** and be completed by **6pm on Thursday 25 January 2018**, weather permitting. **Works will be undertaken 24 hours per day seven days per week during this period.**

The project has been staged to minimise disruption as much as possible to retail, events and cultural and university calendars.

The works include modifying the lids of five existing high voltage SAPN pits in North Terrace and will progress in four stages between Frome Street and Gawler Place.

SA Power Networks will advise its customers directly of any planned outages.

North Terrace will remain open to traffic with one lane in each direction at all times through the work zone. Traffic will be diverted to the northern side of North Terrace and speed restrictions will be in place. Details of the works can be found on the project website www.citytramextension.sa.gov.au

Access to businesses, carparks and properties will be maintained at all times.

Every effort will be made to minimise noise impacts to nearby residents and businesses. However, some noise will be unavoidable during this period.
