



Victor Harbor Road Duplication Project

Current proposal

The Australian and South Australian governments have jointly committed \$92 million in funding for the Victor Harbor Road Duplication Project, to be delivered by the Department for Infrastructure and Transport (the Department).

The Australian Government has also committed an additional \$15 million towards other safety improvements on Victor Harbor Road.

The McLaren Vale region and outer southern suburbs have seen notable growth in recent years and cater to significant tourism activity primarily related to the iconic wine region and associated viticulture and agriculture industries.

This duplication project will improve road safety, improve traffic flow and increase capacity.

The project will involve the duplication of a 4.5 kilometre section of Victor Harbor Road between Main South Road and Main Road, McLaren Vale.

A feature of the concept design includes a new four-way, two-lane roundabout at Robinson Road, including the realignment of Quarry Road.

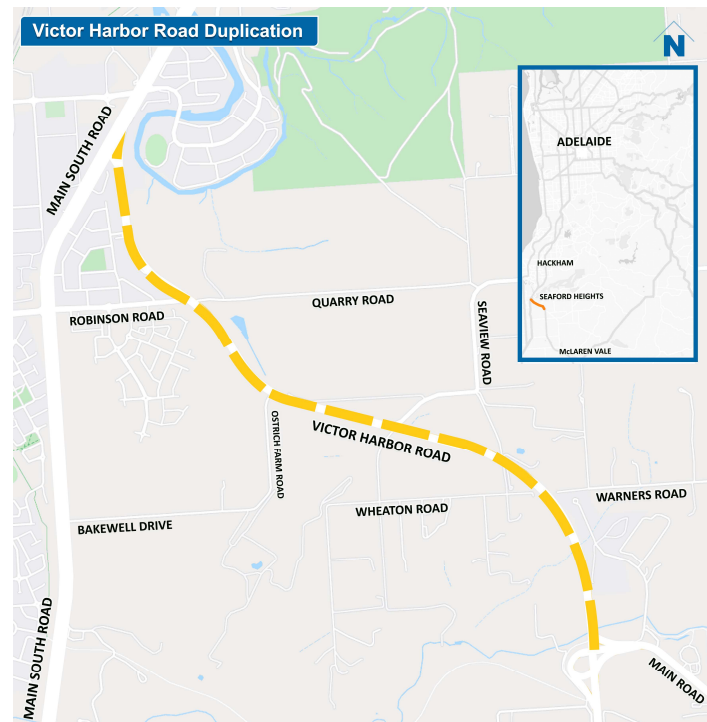
A planning study to develop the concept design has been undertaken, following initial community consultation to identify issues and opportunities along this section of Victor Harbor Road. Site investigations are continuing.

The Department is seeking further feedback from the community on proposed scenarios to inform best outcomes for delivery of this project, in conjunction with the Main South Road Duplication Project. Direct engagement with the community will be a strong focus through the ongoing design development and delivery for this project.

The project is planned to commence in late 2021, with dual lanes open to traffic in 2023.
