APPLICATION UNDER THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1991

I refer to your application made under the *Freedom of Information Act 1991* (the Act), dated 14 March 2023.

Your application seeks access to:

"Documents as defined under Part 1 Section 4 Freedom of Information Act 1991 (SA), pertaining to CFMEU and its advertising campaign on Adelaide Trams, between 7/11/2022 and 14/03/2023."

An extensive search was conducted within this office. A total of 5 documents were identified as answering the terms of your application.

Documents Released in Part

Document 5 is released to you.

Documents Refused in Full

Document 1 is a Parliamentary Briefing Note (PBN) which was prepared specifically for use in Parliament. Disclosing this information would infringe the privilege of Parliament. I have therefore determined this exempt in full pursuant to clause 17(c).

Documents 2 – 4 are Hansard extracts from Question Time in the Legislative Council on the 30 November 2022 and 1 December 2022 about Union Advertising. These documents have not been released as the information is publicly available on the SA Parliament website.

Document 5a contains information which is parliamentary privilege. I therefore determine this exempt pursuant to clause 17(c).

Document 5b contains commercially sensitive information which is not publicly available. I therefore determine this exempt pursuant to clause 7(1)(c).

Exemptions

Clause 7- Documents affecting business affairs

- (1) A document is an exempt document—
 - (c) if it contains matter—
 - (i) consisting of information (other than trade secrets or information referred to in paragraph (b)) concerning the business, professional, commercial or financial affairs of any agency or any other person; and
 - (ii) the disclosure of which-
 - (A) could reasonably be expected to have an adverse effect on those affairs or to prejudice the future supply of such information to the Government or to an agency; and
 - (B) would, on balance, be contrary to the public interest.

Clause 17—Documents subject to contempt etc

A document is an exempt document if it contains matter the public disclosure of which would, but for any immunity of the Crown—

(c) infringe the privilege of Parliament.
