Flood Remediation Works Notice

We are improving flood resilience on the Stuart Highway, near Lake Windabout

The Australian and South Australian governments have committed \$75 million (80:20) over four years to fund the Flood Recovery Targeted Investment to Improve National Supply Chain Resilience program.

What's happening

Flood recovery works on Stuart Highway, Lake Windabout, are continuing. These works will improve flood resilience and remediate sections of road damaged during previous weather events.

For a number of reasons, including inclement weather, completion of these works is now expected in late November 2025, weather permitting.

How this affects you

To safely undertake these works there will continue to be changes to traffic conditions. Speed and lane restrictions will be in place throughout the area for the duration of the works. Outside of working hours speed restrictions will remain in place until all works, including line marking, are complete in late November 2025.

The Stuart Highway will remain open at all times. Traffic may be reduced to a single lane intermittently as required. Please follow the direction of on-site traffic controllers and observe signage.

Access for heavy vehicles will be maintained at all times.

We thank you for your patience while these critical safety upgrades are undertaken.
