Dear Agency Representatives,

As part of the South Australian Productivity Commission recommendations into Government Procurement practices, the Department for Infrastructure and Transport (DIT) was tasked to develop a process that permitted agencies to deliver their own small construction projects if they demonstrated the required delivery capability to do so. The development of this process was also considered as part of the broader review of the Across Government Facilities Management Arrangements (AGFMA).

DIT engaged the services of an external consultant to develop what has been termed the Planned Small Construction (PSC) Accreditation Framework. Governance of the framework development was provided via the AGFMA Reform multi-agency steering committee.

The framework involves two key aspects:

1. the one-off process of an agency seeking accreditation, which then permits them to deliver low risk projects valued less than \$4m (ex GST); and
2. ongoing gated processes and procedures for the delivery of individual projects.

This email is to advise the PSC Accreditation Framework is now active, and agencies can commence the accreditation application process, noting that should an agency become accredited soon, it will then be permitted to commence delivery of its projects from 1 July 2022.
