ATLM works notice

We are delivering critical road safety upgrades and improvements on remote, regional, urban roads, footpaths and cycle paths around South Australia.

The \$168 million program is jointly funded by the Australian (50%) and South Australian (50%) governments over three years.

What's happening

Works are progressing well across the Road Safety Program. Major works are complete on the Mallee Highway, Lincoln Highway, Thiele Highway, RM Williams Way, Mannum Road and Main South Road.

Throughout the remainder of the year, we will be undertaking Audio Tactile Line Marking (ATLM) installation at suitable locations across all Road Safety Program project corridors.

ATLM is used to reduce rural 'run-off-road' road crashes by providing a noise (audio) and vibratory (tactile) warning to road users.

ATLM will only be installed in areas where posted speeds are 100kmh or higher and will not be installed within 200m of dwellings.
