Department of Planning, Transport and Infrastructure (DPTI), in partnership with the Motor Accident Commission recently awarded further Community Grants for safer, greener and more active travel. The successful applicants for February 2016 are:

Basil Hetzel Institute Creating new habits	This project will promote healthy choices for Support staff and researchers at the Basil Hetzel Institute by introducing electric bikes to their fleet. Riding an electric bike to workplace meetings and other work related destinations, will result in a reduction of car trips.	\$5,185.50
Community Living Options Hail independence here!	This project provides one on one support for clients to gain skills and confidence to catch public transport. The project will assist clients to incorporate public transport as their main form of transport and boost independence.	\$1,000.00
City of Unley Unley Staff Bike Fleet	This project will support staff at the City of Unley to replace short work car trips with riding a workplace bike to meetings and other work related destinations.	\$4,338.00
Maxima Group Inc Lets MAX greener, more active travel!	This project will support Maxima staff to utilise public transport for work journeys and encourage staff to actively travel for their work commute. This includes cycling instead of driving.	\$2,050.00
Umoona Tjutagku Health Service	This project will provide students who are novice cyclists with bike riding skills and bike maintenance training. They will connect with other cycling groups, community organisations and positive role models and peers. This will encourage ongoing	\$7,790

Yorke Peninsula Community Transport Inc Moving towards technology	With funds provided by the Motor Accident Commission, this project will provide video conferencing equipment for the Yorke Peninsula Community Transport Inc for staff, Board members and volunteers to avoid travelling long distances for face-to-face meetings. By reducing the travel on country roads, there will be a reduction of risk of being involved in a crash.	\$11,138.00
Southern Cross Care (Lourdes Valley) Let's go ride a bike!	Southern Cross Care will introduce a rickshaw tricycle to be used by volunteers, family members and some residents, instead of vehicles when taking residents on outings. This will encourage a reconnection with community, the outdoors and exercise, as well as being environmentally friendly.	\$6,500.00
