Rosewater Railway Project Update

June 2025

The South Australian Government has committed to converting the disused railway line through Rosewater and Ottoway into a green open space for the community.

The Rosewater Loop project extends from the Outer Harbor Greenway on Russell Street to the existing path near McNicol Terrace, Rosewater.

It will better connect the suburbs of Rosewater, Ottoway and Gillman with the Outer Harbor Greenway and Port Adelaide centre; provide improved access to land for the communities of Rosewater, Ottoway and Gillman; and enable long-term retention of the rail.



What's happened

We have been working with local stakeholders to form the Rosewater Loop Stakeholder Reference Group (SRG). The SRG has met three times to share their ideas and help shape the project, so it reflects the community's vision.

The community told us their top priorities are:

- accessible water points;
- a shared use path; and
- lighting to improve the look and feel of the area.

We've made good progress so far:

- An unused cabinet has been turned into a community storage unit.
- Clean-up of illegally dumped items along the Rosewater Loop has occurred.
- Water points are being installed, with locations chosen through SRG input.
- To improve safety, we are installing signs and surveillance to prevent illegal dumping.

We would like to thank the members of the SRG for volunteering their time and gardening skills to support planting. Local schools will also be involved to create artwork at specific locations along the Rosewater Loop.

What's next

- We're now in the delivery stage of the project.
- SA Water will install water points to help keep plants healthy.
- A gravel path will be built from Russell Street to Leader Street to improve local connections, with new landscaping added.
- Two new sealed paths will be constructed to connect Leader Street and Kelmscott Street as well as Henry Street and Neptune Terrace.
- Existing sealed connection at Eastbourne Terrace will be upgraded.
- Surveillance cameras and signs will be added in areas where illegal dumping happens often.
- Artwork will be installed with help from the local school, to build community pride and reduce vandalism.
