

Princes Highway Corridor Upgrade

Pavement works, Mount Gambier

We are upgrading the Princes Highway Corridor, from Meningie to the South Australian/Victorian border, to improve long term safety and efficiency for all road users. The \$190 million Princes Highway Corridor program is jointly funded by the Australian (80%) and South Australian (20%) governments.

What's happening

We are undertaking pavement works to improve road surface quality. Works involve removing the existing pavement and replacing it with new asphalt.

How this affects you

Early works including service locations will commence from Wednesday 3 April 2024. **Pavement works will then commence from Monday 15 April 2024.**

To do this work safely, we'll have speed and lane restrictions in work areas. One lane of traffic in each direction will be maintained on Jubilee Highway West (Princes Highway) at all times. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers, and follow the speed limits and signs.

You will still be able to access businesses and homes. If we need to limit access to driveways, advance notice will be provided. Pedestrians and cyclists, please be cautious when passing through work zones. Some areas might have limited access for safety reasons. We'll put up signs to guide you to other routes if needed.

During the works, there might be some noisy disruptions from time to time, but we'll do our best to keep the noise to a minimum. You might also notice some odours, which is normal during asphalt work.

No works will be undertaken on Thursday 25 April 2024 for the Anzac Day Public Holiday.
