



Cape Jervis and Kangaroo Island Ports Upgrade

Project Overview

Site establishment and early works are now underway at **Penneshaw** before major works start in early May 2024.

Major works to upgrade the port infrastructure at **Cape Jervis** are underway and progressing well. This update provides an overview of key activities coming up in the coming months.

Cape Jervis Update

Since March our contractor has been busy constructing a haul road, temporary crane pad, and permanent foundations for the new vessel passenger access behind the SeaLink terminal building.

Throughout May, night works will be undertaken to install rock anchors (provides stability to the new infrastructure) in Cape Jervis. These works are happening at night to ensure we minimise impacts to ferry services. Hours of work are Monday to Friday, from 7pm to 7am. The majority of other works will continue to be undertaken during the day.

Smoking Ceremony and Welcome to Country

To mark the start of major works at Cape Jervis, Ngarrindjeri elder Mark Koolmatrie delivered a Welcome to Country and Smoking Ceremony on Tuesday 19 March 2024. Project representatives, along with Council and the local community gathered around the Cape Jervis Lighthouse while Mark welcomed attendees to Ngarrindjeri country.

This event was a key milestone for the project, and we are proud to work with the Traditional Custodians of the Country throughout South Australia to recognise their continuing connection to land and waters, and pay our respects to Elders past, present and emerging.

Penneshaw Update

Major works at Penneshaw will start from Wednesday 8 May 2024. As previously advised, the **Penneshaw Public Jetty will be closed from 6am on Wednesday 8 May**, noting the first section of major works will focus on the demolition of the existing jetty. To ensure we minimise impacts to ferry services these demolition works will mostly occur at night.

In the coming weeks, SeaLink staff access at Penneshaw will be temporarily relocated. Preparatory works to facilitate this staff access change will commence shortly and will mostly be undertaken at night. Most construction work at Penneshaw will generally occur during the day between 7am and 7pm Monday to Saturday with some Sundays and night works as required. Advance notice of any significant impacts or changes will be provided.

Changed traffic conditions within the Penneshaw Harbour Precinct will be in place until project completion however coach and bus parking will remain nearby to ensure passengers can continue to safely access the terminal. Signage and on-site traffic controllers will be in place. We will continue to liaise with all tourism and transport industry stakeholders to advise of any future changes.

Penneshaw Harbour Precinct Master Plan

Master plans for the Cape Jervis precinct and Penneshaw Harbour Precinct are currently being developed, with the Penneshaw draft plan to be shared for feedback in the coming months.
