Road Safety Program

Lincoln Highway Safety Upgrades, Whyalla to Cowell

We are delivering critical road safety upgrades to the Lincoln Highway between Whyalla and Cowell

These works are jointly funded by the Australian (50%) and South Australian (50%) governments as part of the \$168 million National Road Safety Program over 3 years.

What's happening

We are undertaking safety upgrades at various locations on the Lincoln Highway between Whyalla and Cowell. Works will include:

- Shoulder widening and sealing
- Audio Tactile Line Marking
- New line marking
- Vegetation management

Audio Tactile Line Marking is used to reduce "run-off-road' or cross carriageway crashes by creating a noise (audio) and vibratory (tactile) warning to road users who have strayed from the road lane.

The upgrades are designed to improve freight efficiency and support regional economic growth and improve safety for all road users.

How this affects you

The Lincoln Highway will remain open at all times, however, to do this work safely we'll have speed and lane restrictions in place throughout work areas. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers, and follow the speed limits and signs.

Outside of work hours speed restrictions will remain in place for the duration of works. You will still be able to access homes and properties. If temporary access restrictions are required advance notice will be provided.
