

Road Safety Package

Flinders Highway Safety Upgrades

We are delivering critical road safety upgrades to the Flinders Highway.

The State Government has allocated \$10 million over four years (2024-2027) for targeted road safety initiatives on rural roads, including audio tactile line marking, safety barriers and rural junction activated warning system signage.

What's happening

We are undertaking safety upgrades at various locations on the Flinders Highway between Port Lincoln and Wangary. Works will include:

- shoulder sealing
- safety barrier installation
- culvert extensions
- Audio Tactile Line Marking (ATLM)

The upgrades are designed to improve freight efficiency, support regional economic growth and improve safety for all road users.

How this affects you

The Flinders Highway will remain open at all times.

To do this work safely there will be changes to traffic conditions for the duration of works. During work hours speed and lane restrictions will be in place throughout the area. Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers and follow onsite signage.

Outside of working hours, lanes will be reopened to two-way traffic, however speed restrictions will remain in place subject to onsite conditions.

Access to properties will be maintained at all times.

ATLM will be installed following completion of major works later in 2025.
