Road Safety Program

Mannum Road, Mannum to Murray Bridge

We are delivering critical road safety upgrades and improvements on remote, regional, urban roads, footpaths, and cycle paths around South Australia.

The \$168 million Road Safety Program is jointly funded by the Australian (50%) and South Australian (50%) Governments over three years.

What's happening

We will be installing audio tactile line marking (ATLM) along Mannum Road between Mannum and Murray Bridge. ATLM is used to reduce "run-off-road" or cross carriageway crashes by creating a noise (audio) and vibratory (tactile) warning to road users who have strayed from the road lane.

How this affects you

To do this work safely we'll have speed and lane restrictions with stop/slow traffic management in place in work areas as work progressively moves along Mannum Road, from Mannum towards Murray Bridge.

Please plan your trips, be cautious around workers, and follow the speed limits and traffic controllers at all times.

Outside of work hours speed and lane restrictions will be removed.

Mannum Road will remain open at all times.
