

Glen Osmond Road and Fullarton Road Intersection Upgrade

Night Works Update

The Australian and South Australian governments have jointly (50:50) committed \$35 million to upgrade the Glen Osmond Road and Fullarton Road intersection. Once complete, the upgrade will improve travel times and road safety, increase intersection capacity and enhance network reliability.

Major construction commenced in 2022, and with project completion expected in late 2023, weather permitting. Night works will continue to be undertaken as required until project completion.

The information below provides an update on the status of construction works to date and key works occurring during May and June 2023, weather permitting. Future updates will be provided outlining progress and upcoming night works as the project continues.

Continuing works

- Construction of road pavements (asphalt works), footpath pavements, kerbs/crossovers and on the north-eastern, north-western and south-western corners of the intersection.
- Traffic signal installation within the intersection.
- Temporary and permanent line-marking.
- Drainage installation on the north-eastern and south-eastern corners of the intersection.

Upcoming works during May and June 2023

- Construction of road pavements (asphalt works), footpath pavements, kerbs/crossovers on the south eastern-corner of the intersection.
- Construction of new signalised pedestrian crossing on Fullarton Road.
- Relocation of bus stop 5 on Fullarton Road west, Fullarton Road east and Glen Osmond Road north.
- Drainage installation on the north-eastern and south-eastern corners of the intersection.

Hours of work

To minimise impacts to road users the majority of work will continue to be undertaken at night between 7pm and 6am, Sunday to Thursday, as required. No work will be undertaken at night on Friday and Saturday nights.

Some intermittent works will continue to be undertaken during between 7am – 5pm, Monday to Saturday, as required

Pedestrian and cyclist access changes

Some temporary pedestrian and cyclist detours will be in place around the works site and pedestrians and cyclists are advised to take care and follow directional signage when travelling through the area.

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Traffic changes

During the works, the intersection will remain open to traffic at all times.

To safely undertake these works, lane and speed restrictions will be in place along Glen Osmond Road, Fullarton Road and intersecting side streets. Local road closures may be required during works and local detours will be in place. Advance notice will be provided.

Please plan ahead, allow extra travel time and take extra care when workers are on site.

Observe speed limits, lane restrictions and traffic controllers when travelling through the area.

Access to businesses and residential properties will be maintained. In the event that access restrictions are necessary, property owners will be notified in advance by the project team.

Noise, vibration, and light spill

Some noise disturbance can be expected at times while these works are completed, however the work will be managed to minimise disturbance to nearby residents and businesses as much as practically possible. This includes scheduling intrusive works early evening where possible. You may also notice some odour which is common when asphaltting works are underway.
